# **GLEANING:** ~JANUARY 2022 GLEANERS: SPRINGS RESCUE MISSION

VISION: To see lives transformed & filled with hope as our community works together to fight homelessness, poverty and addiction.

Springs Rescue Mission began in 1996, when founders began providing sandwiches to homeless people in Colorado Springs in parks & under bridges. Soon after, they opened a food pantry in one room of a small building. These humble beginnings rapidly grew into a wide range of programs intended to serve the 27,000 households living below the poverty line in the Pikes Peak region. Currently, they serve over 700 men & women a day through nutritious meals, sheltering, case management & work programs.

TOP REQUESTS at this time are: travel size shampoo & conditioner, hotel size bar soap, disposable razors (2 blades minimum), laundry pods (they do 30,000 loads per year) and hats, gloves & coats for these winter months.

THANK YOU for thinking of the most vulnerable men & women in our community!! Donating goods to Springs Rescue Mission has a significant & direct impact on those who are served.



## Program

In January, CMNC is fortunate to welcome Katie Edson who will speak about library resources and non-profit organizations. Katie is the Strategic Services Librarian for the Pikes Peak Library District.

Although Katie began working in libraries as a middle schooler, she did not become a professional librarian until 2010. First earning a B.S. in Natural Resources Management from Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo in California and then working for the park service, the forest service, and the environmental division for the department of defense, she finally found her way to Emporia State University and their school of library and information management in 2008. Since earning her Master of Library Science degree, she has worked in K-12 schools, public, and academic libraries. Currently, she works for the Pikes Peak Library District as their nonprofit librarian. She assists the nonprofit community in finding the resources they need to make a positive impact in the Pikes Peak region. Katie is from the San Francisco Bay Area and has lived across the United States, Europe, and Asia with her active-duty (now retired) Army husband and family. After a ridiculous number of moves, she hopes Colorado Springs will be her forever home!

When not helping people in the community find the information they need to do good, she can be found outside doing all the Colorado things - hiking with her dog, trail running, rock climbing, mountain biking, skiing, or inside baking sourdough.




