Gleaners

Outside before our monthly CMNC meetings CPCD (formerly known as Community Partnership for Child Development) is our non-profit for September. Founded in 1987, they originally funded 300 kids in one program. Now, through the Colorado Preschool, Early Head Start and Head Start programs, they serve more than 1,800 children daily in 63 Early Connections Learning Centers across six county school districts and Ft. Carson. Many families benefitting from CPCD have experienced job loss, homelessness and significant family stress, and are considered high-risk families.

REQUESTED DONATIONS: Preschool books for ages 0-5, puzzles, toothbrushes for kids, and Crest toothpaste.

NOTE: We still collect empty pill bottles (minus labels) every month. These are utilized by West Side Cares as containers for personal hygiene products. Please leave your donations in the open trunk of my car before our monthly meetings. It'll be parked just outside the entrance of the buliding.
